Dear TRRA Community,

I hope this finds everyone staying healthy and getting out to enjoy some of the great weather we have had over the last few weeks!

Here are a few quick organizational updates as we head into the final weekend of June:

T.R.A.P. Phase: 2.2

As the confirmed number of cases of Covid-19 continues to go up daily in Allegheny County, TRRA will remain at T.R.A.P. Phase 2.2 until at least July 3, 2020.

| Campus | <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Buildings remain CLOSED except to staff.- Bays at both campuses are open with a strict capacity limit of 2 people per bay at a time.- Docks are open with Social Distancing Protocols in place.- Dock capacity increased to 6 singles at a time. |
| Equipment | <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Privately owned boats.- Club 1x's, 2-/x, and Out-Rigger Canoes.- If rowing a 2-/x, both rowers/paddlers MUST BE FROM THE SAME HOUSEHOLD.- 2 people may carry a boat, if needed, as long as they remain at least 6-feet apart at all times. |
| Program | <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Private Boat Owners, Log-Book Scullers/Paddlers & adaptive*- Coached groups in 1x's only (or household 2-/x) with no more than 2 pods to a group.- Each outing must be scheduled using the reservation system.- Strict social distancing protocols must be followed. |

Additional Updates:

- **Private Lessons:** We have been receiving many requests for private lessons over the last few weeks and we hear you. We are actively exploring ways that we can safely make this happen this summer. More information will be shared as it becomes available.
- **Fleet Increasing:** Thanks to the generosity of several individuals, families, and local partner organizations, we will be adding some additional boats to our fleet for use during Coached pod sessions over the next few weeks. Some of these boats will be here temporarily, others long term. These boats will be a great asset for our entire community this summer and beyond. We will be sharing more details as the boats arrive on our campuses. Thank you to everyone who helped make this possible!

We are continuing to monitor the quickly evolving information coming from the Commonwealth and other governing bodies. It is our intention to increase the rowing and paddling opportunities as soon as safely and responsibility possible. For this to happen, we all have to work together, understand that there will be trials & errors along the way, and work together to correct our course as we continue to move forward.

Thank you all for your continued support and understanding throughout this entire process. We are looking forward to seeing more of our community safely return to the water in the coming days and weeks.
